8. Rotary Club Management Challenge John Langford jandglangford@aol.co.uk and Steve Atkinson

- 8.1 Target Six Form (4-6 in a team) need 4-6 teams to make it worthwhile.
- 8.2 The Challenge starts with all teams on an equal basis with cash, factory capacity, raw materials and finished goods. It progresses for an indeterminate length with the management (us) offering to sell raw material at a minimum price. Each team can then bid, at that price or higher, for what they think they will need. After payment of fixed overhead costs relative to the amount of raw material and factory capacity they then turn the raw material into finished goods. The next stage is for us to offer to buy goods at a maximum price allowing each team to decide what to offer. At each stage the price paid by each team for raw material and finished goods is made available to all so it is important that someone is paying attention to what the competition is doing. When the teams have started to get the hang of the exercise we introduce elements of the real world such as varying supply and demand, strikes, recession etc., to keep them on their toes
